■What is evacuation areas?

When a large earthquake occurs, it is important to protect ourselves from secondary disasters such as spreading fires that can potentially cost the lives of large numbers of people. The evacuation areas are designed to be places where people can take refuge temporarily. The Tokyo Metropolitan has designated 12 evacuation areas in Koto City.

What is fire-safe areas?

This refers to areas where large urban fires do not tend to occur. The Tokyo Metropolitan designates these areas as spots where residents are able to evacuate to a safe place within a short distance (about one block) even if a fire occurs, and where evacuations over long distances are not required.





Plan Evacuating in the **Event of Large-scale** Flooding

Where large-scale flooding is forecast, a call for evacuation will be broadcast over the municipal disaster prevention radio system or similar system by the Koto City Office or the fire department.

If you hear an evacuation announcement, promptly evacuate to public facilities or temporary evacuation centers indicated by Koto City. In such event, it is important to evacuate to higher floors.

Temporary evacuation centers

In Koto City, as a strategy to address large-scale flooding caused by flooding of the Arakawa River, tsunami, etc., Koto City has agreements with specified corporations to provide temporary



This survey has been held roughly every five years since 1975 based on Tokyo metropolitan earthquake disaster prevention regulations. Published most recently in February 2018, this is the eighth time the survey has been conducted. Overall risk evels—including building collapse risk, fire risk, and disaster relief initiative difficulty levels will be assessed for all urban areas of the Tokyo Metropolitan.



Fire risk is assessed by identifying the possibility of damage caused by spreading of earthquake-induced fires. The assessment is a combination of the likelihood of fire starting in the area (presence of numerous flammable structures and vulnerability to shaking) plus the likelihood of spreading fire (density and structure of buildings). Even if the location itself is not prone to fire outbreaks, there remains the risk of fire spreading from other areas. This risk is also added into the equation.



In Koto City, a total of 155 districts are covered under the survey. The figure below indicates risk levels for these three categories, assigning ranks in the range of one (low risk) to five (high risk) for each of the districts. These are highlighted with different colors for easier viewing. Get a sense of the risk level in the area where you live and remember this risk in your day-to-day preparations.



In addition to building collapse risk and fire risk, degree of difficulty of evacuation, etc. (calculated based on number of roads of a certain width or wider, plus time required to reach even wider roads) is added in to create a single index. It is hoped that this index will be useful in helping residents to consider how to address earthquakes and prepare for them.

Note the importance of preparing supplies ahead of time in case of disaster.

Supplies to be carried in case of emergency can be

categorized broadly into primary supplies and secondary supplies. The latter are collected once safety has been secured.

Keep emergency supplies together on a daily basis so that they can be taken out at any time. In addition, to ensure that the supplies will be useable when you need them, inspect them about twice a year, noting expiration

Remember that these items should be enough to keep you self-sufficient for the period of time required until recovery from the disaster is within sight (at least three days). Food and drinks...Drinking water (approximately three



Disaster Emergency Message Dial System

The Disaster Emergency Message Dial system is a special service operated during times of disaster, including earthquakes, at which time people may have difficulty getting through on the telephone due to extremely high call volume. This recorded message system can be used to communicate with family and friends regarding the safety of individuals, where to meet, etc. Koto City residents can practice using the system on the dates noted below. Evacuating from High-rise Residential Buildings

In general, residents should proceed to evacuation centers at elementary and junior high schools, etc. However, if you live in an earthquake-proof building, and you are able to

stay in your home, it may be preferable to do so. If you are able to remain in your own home, and you live in a condominium or residential complex, please take the following actions. It is especially important that you

work with disaster relief teams.



Meet at the temporary meeting place determined ahead of time at your apartment complex, etc. Check on fires and damage incurred by buildings

In general, residents should stay If fires have broken out or in their homes if their residence is significant damage has occurred, residents should move to sound enough to continue living in and no fires have broken out. designated evacuation centers.

Check on safety of occupants of individual homes and collect information

Do disaster relief teams keep a list of individuals who need assistance evacuating?

Yes Disaster relief teams visit the homes of people on the list, confirming their safety and/or assisting them to evacuate in accordance with individualized plans.

No Disaster relief teams visit the homes of people on the list from designated evacuation centers, confirming their safety and/or assisting them to evacuate in accordance with individualized plans.

Points of caution for taking shelter in one's home Information and commodities provided by Koto City and others are delivered to designated evacuation

centers. Note that supplies will not be distributed at residential complexes. Some residents of residential complexes may be accepted at evacuation centers.

If you decide to take shelter in your home, please help out evacuation centers by gathering information and commodities as a contribution to the local community.
