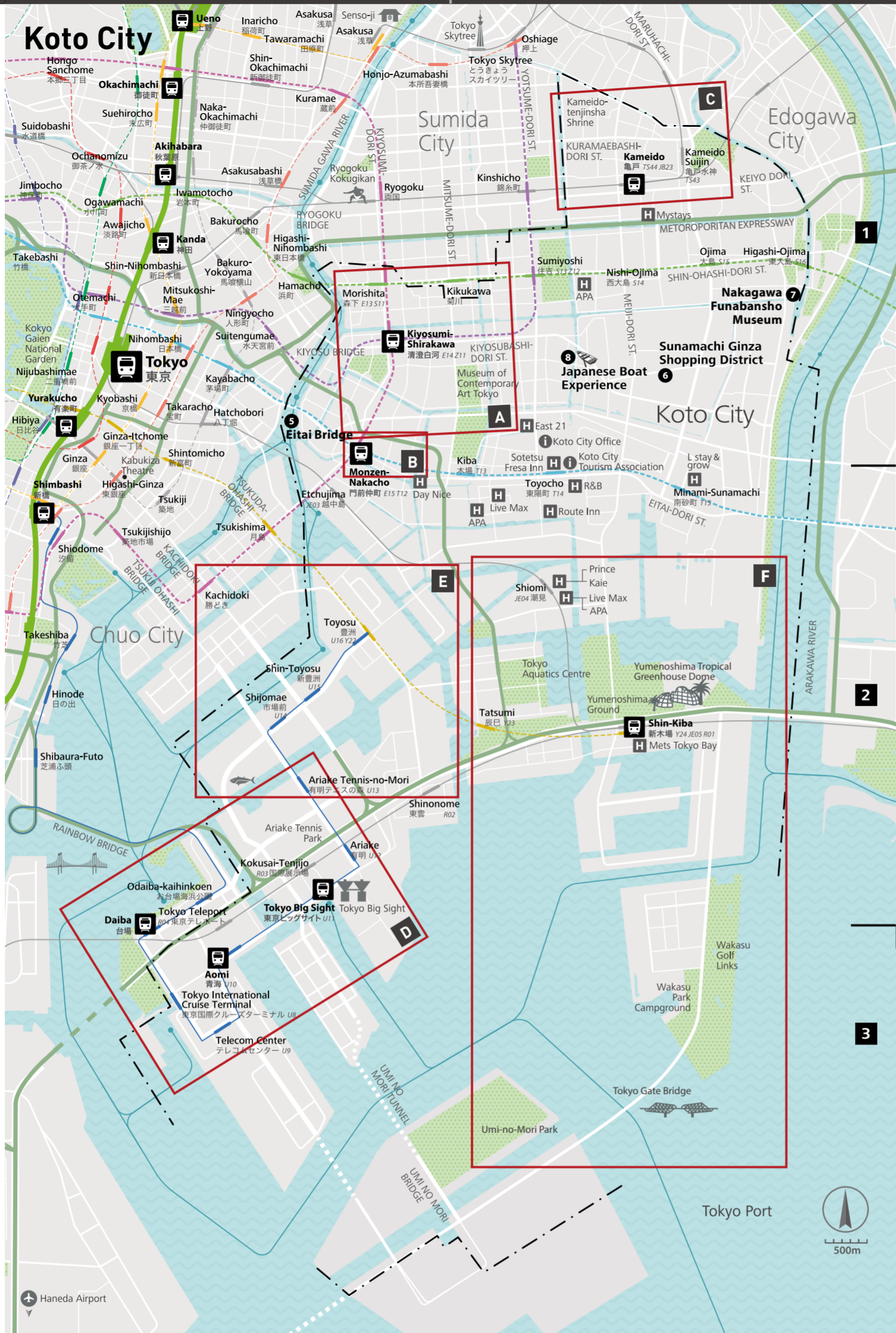


# KOTO CITY in TOKYO OFFICIAL TOURIST MAP



## Welcome to Koto City!

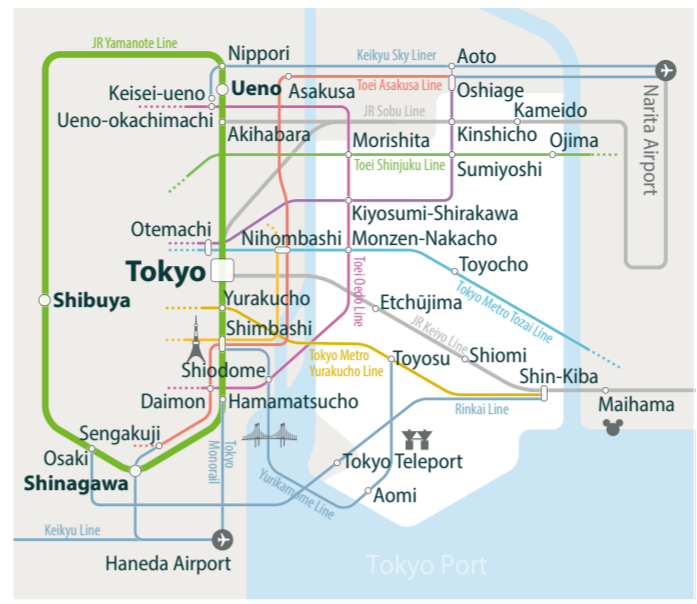
Located in the eastern part of Tokyo, Koto City combines the unique appeal of tradition, the future, and a cityscape that evokes a watercolor painting. It's a place where the traditions of the Edo period live on, allowing visitors to experience the nostalgic atmosphere of an old town. It's also a cutting-edge area that thrives on the latest trends in art and culture, and a modern urban space with towering skyscrapers, shopping centers, and entertainment facilities that fuel a vibrant, metropolitan vibe. Moreover, Koto City is known for its watercolor-like landscapes, extensive water and greenery, and tranquil, relaxing spaces. With this guide in hand, you're ready to explore and experience the multifaceted appeal of Koto City!



- 1 Tokyo Gate Bridge MAP:U-2**  
This enormous bridge, measuring 2,618 meters in length and spanning across the Port of Tokyo, is open to pedestrians during the day. It's also lit daily from sunset until midnight, making it a great spot from which to enjoy nighttime scenery of the bay.
- 2 Yumenoshima Tropical Greenhouse Dome MAP:U-1**  
This botanical museum is located inside Yumenoshima Park. Filled with tropical and subtropical plants, the gigantic greenhouse resembles a jungle! The museum also has a theatre and an exhibition hall. <https://www.yumenoshima.jp/botanicalhall>
- 3 Daigo Fukuryu Maru Exhibition Hall MAP:U-1**  
"Daigo Fukuryu-Maru," a wooden deep-sea tuna fishing boat that was exposed to radiation in a 1954 U.S. hydrogen bomb test in the Pacific Ocean, is on display along with related materials to teach visitors about the history of deep-sea fishing and encourage them to reflect on peace. <http://d5f.org/en>
- 4 Yumenoshima Park MAP:U-1**  
A metropolitan park built on Yumenoshima, an artificial island created by reclaiming a part of Tokyo Bay. The park also contains a tropical botanical garden, a track-and-field arena and various other sports facilities, a BBQ area, and an archery range used in the Tokyo 2020 Games. <https://www.yumenoshima.jp/en/park>
- 5 Eitai Bridge MAP:S-1**  
Originally built in 1698 (although the current structure was constructed later), this bridge has been designated an Important Cultural Property by the Japanese government.
- 6 Sunamachi Ginza Shopping District MAP:T-1**  
This street, where local residents shop on a daily basis, is attracting visitors who are looking for delicious, inexpensive food and other distinctive trappings of Japan's old town areas. <https://sunamachi-ginza.com/>
- 7 Nakagawa Funabansho Museum MAP:T-1**  
This museum specializes in the history of water transport, which was used to carry cargo from the city's rivers to the larger Kanto region and other destinations nationwide. A diorama recreates the Nakagawa Lookout on the Onagi River from which boat traffic to and from the city of Edo was monitored and controlled. <https://www.kcf.or.jp/nakagawa/>
- 8 Japanese Boat Experience MAP:T-1**  
Visitors can experience what it's like to ride on a Japanese boat, free of charge, at the seaside pier in Yokojikengawa-shinshu Park. Same-day reservations are accepted (although prior reservations are required for groups). Check the website in advance as boats depart about once a week on a schedule that varies with the seasons. <https://wasen-tomo.com>

## Getting to Koto City

An extensive rail network, including JR and subway lines, and numerous city bus routes make it easy to get to the city. Water buses offer regular service across the Sumida River and canal, making it easy to get to Koto from Odaiba and Asakusa.

### Community Cycles (Bicycle sharing)

Expand your sphere of activities by using the Community Cycle bike sharing service to explore Koto in a fun and efficient way. Bicycles feature power assist technology. Cycle ports are located throughout the city, allowing riders to enjoy the community's appeal in every corner of the city. Riders are also free to visit neighboring cities, including Sumida City, Chuo City, and Minato City. <https://docomo-cycle.jp/tokyo/>

### Fukagawa and Joto shuttle buses

Fukagawa and Joto shuttle bus service is a convenient way to get around on Saturdays, Sundays, and public holidays. Two types of sightseeing shuttle bus operate in the city. The Fukagawa Shuttle (Toei bus: Rapid-06 route) provides rapid service between Morishita Station and the National Museum of Emerging Science and Innovation (Miraikan). The Joto Shuttle (Toei bus: Rapid 05 route) departs Kinshicho Station and connects the Joto district to Tokyo Waterfront City. <https://www.city.koto.lg.jp/103010/bunkasports/kanko/kotoku/bus2018.html>

### Tokyo BRT

To make transportation in the rapidly developing coastal area even more convenient, a bus-based rapid transit system known as BRT is currently in service. There are several routes that leave Shimbashi for Ariake and Toyosu. The time on the route between Shimbashi and Kokusai-tenjijo is about 15 min.
