Types of Portable Toilets to Be Distributed

First, try using these toilets, then stockpile supplies for the portable toilet type you find easy to use.

1 Coagulant Type

Hardens waste using a coagulant

This type quickly hardens waste into a jelly-like form, making it easy to handle afterwards. It is a convenient portable toilet to stockpile since it can be stored compactly.

2 Absorbent Pad Type

A pad absorbs waste

This type uses an absorbent pad to quickly absorb waste. The pad is placed inside a bag, making it easy for children and seniors to use.

3 Coagulant Type with Odor-Proof Bag

Emphasizes odor control

This type includes an odor-proof bag, designed to keep odor from escaping, as part of a set. This is especially convenient in a disaster, when the toilet must be stored indoors after use.

Message from the Mayor

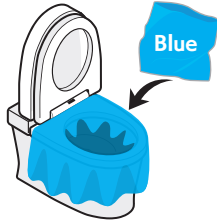
Since no one knows when a disaster will occur, the city is preparing by providing three types of portable toilets to all residents. Portable toilets are a necessity to continue living with peace of mind in the event of a disaster, when you cannot use your home toilet due to suspension of the water supply or other issues. I hope this will be an opportunity to actually try these toilets, learn their features and how to use them, and consider the preparations that are right for your family. Let's take this chance to revise toilet measures for emergencies and always be ready.

How to Use a Portable Emergency Toilet

STEP 1

Lift the toilet seat and place
the toilet liner bag (blue*) on the toilet bowl.

*Household garbage bags, etc., can be used, aside from the blue liner bags distributed.



What is the purpose of a toilet liner bag?

Placing a liner bag on the toilet bowl prevents you from getting wet or dirty when attaching a waste disposal bag. The toilet liner bag itself will not be soiled with waste, so there is no need to change it with each use.

STEP 2

Use the portable toilet.

*How to use the toilet varies depending on the type.

STEP 3

Place the waste disposal bag
inside the odor-proof bag (white) before disposal.

Portable Toilet Disposal Instructions in Koto City

Unused: Please dispose of these items on burnable garbage collection days. Place them inside the same bag as other burnable garbage for disposal.

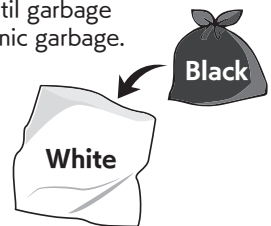
Used under normal circumstances (during a drill, etc.): Flush the solid waste down the toilet after removing the absorbent agent attached to it, and dispose of what is left on burnable garbage collection days. Place them inside the same bag as other burnable garbage for disposal.

Used during a disaster: Separate used portable toilets from other household garbage and keep them at home until garbage collection resumes. After garbage collection resumes, these items will be prioritized for collection as burnable organic garbage.

What is the purpose of an odor-proof bag?

An odor-proof bag prevents waste odor from escaping, so it can be thrown away without worry.

It reduces any concern about storage or sanitation, whether during a drill or in an emergency.
